


The Presenter: Eileen Foti teaches Printmaking at William Paterson University. Previously, she was an Assistant Professor at Montclair State University, the Master Printer of the Brodsky Center for Innovative Editions at Rutgers University, and the Interim Education Director at Tamarind Institute. Her work is included in museum, corporate, and private collections around the world. She has received fellowships from the NJ State Council on the Arts, the New Jersey State Council for the Humanities, and the MidAtlantic Arts Foundation.



Foti teaches intensive printmaking workshops for artists, as well as Professional Development sessions for K-12 teachers from schools throughout the State of NJ. She teaches yearly workshops for the Artist-Teacher-Institute Program. In addition, Foti participates in long-term AIE residencies in NJ schools, which involves hundreds of students in cross-disciplinary projects, as well as helping the teachers to develop new strategies to stimulate learning in and through the arts, while achieving state learning standards and addressing classroom objectives.

This hands-on printmaking workshop will focus on the Chipboard Relief technique, an inexpensive, non-toxic printmaking process that can be successfully completed with or without the use of a press. It can be simplified for elementary school students to enjoy, but can also be sophisticated enough to be used by professional artists.

An ordinary sheet of chipboard (the same thin type that cereal boxes are made from) is used for this process, along with water-based inks, and printing by hand. Where two colors overlap, a third color is created. The technique is perfect for home studios and classrooms, as cleanup can be done with soap and water!



This workshop includes a visual presentation with lecture, examples of methods and projects as well as reference materials for the classroom. It is for teachers working at all levels. No experience in art making is necessary. Teachers will use simple and accessible materials to work on productive exercises. The content and activities of this workshop meet with national standards and are widely applicable throughout the K-12 curriculum. This is an enjoyable workshop and a great opportunity to gather new ideas for enriching the curriculum in the classroom, try some creative art activities, and meet other teachers.
